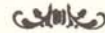

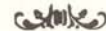
THE COLLEGE CENTER BOARD

FOOD SERVICE AREAS:

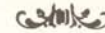
1. Cafeteria

This room provides an opportunity to read current newspapers and periodicals, as well as a quiet area for study.

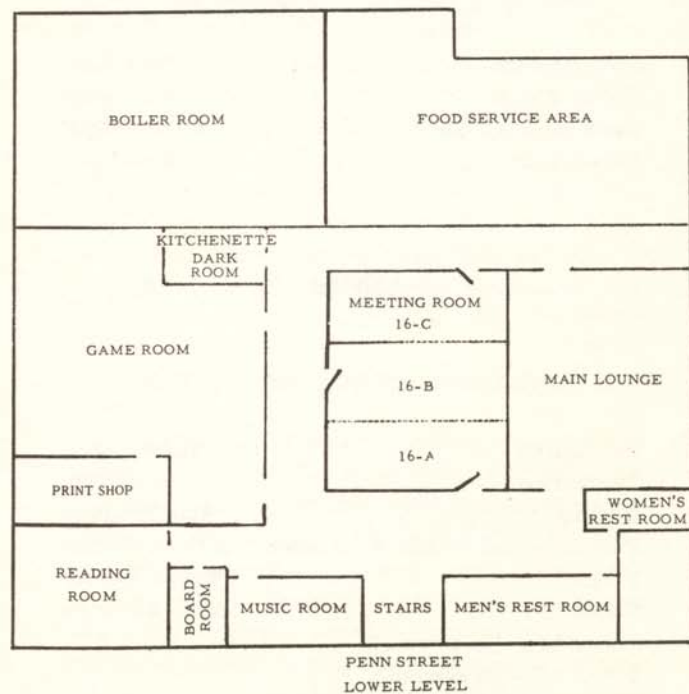
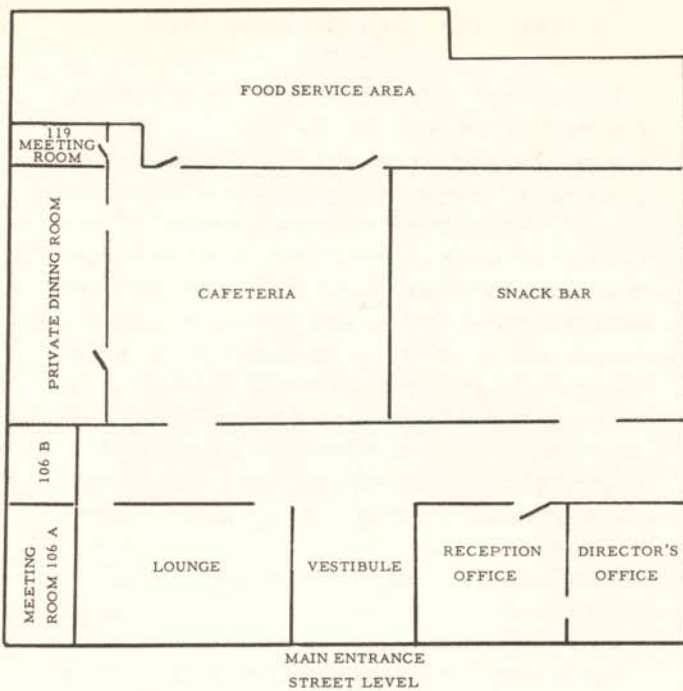


MEETING ROOM (reservations required)

1. Room 119. This room is designed for small committee meetings and conferences. It has a capacity of ten persons, and may also be scheduled for small luncheon meetings.

2. Room 106. (A & B) This room has a capacity of fifty persons, by utilizing the built-in folding door, it can be converted into two smaller meeting rooms with a capacity of twenty-five persons each.

3. Room -16 (A, B & C) This room is the main meeting room and has a capacity of one hundred and twenty persons. It can also be divided into smaller sections each with a capacity of forty persons.



FACILITIES OF THE COLLEGE CENTER

MAIN LOUNGE:

In addition to the normal functions of a lounge, this main lounge will also be used for special events such as informal musicals, receptions, movies, etc.

RECREATION AREAS:

This room is equipped with two pocket billiard tables and a ping-pong table.

DUPLICATING FACILITIES:

The College Center provides the following duplicating facilities at a nominal fee: poster printing, spirit ditto machine, mimeograph, and photo copying. These facilities are available to all students and organizations. Requests must be submitted on the proper form which is available at the College Center office.

TICKET SALES:

Organizations wishing to conduct ticket sales in the College Center, as well as advertise the event, must make the necessary arrangements with the office of the College Center.

EQUIPMENT:

For special events held in the College Center, additional equipment will be made available. This includes microphones, portable sound systems, lecterns, lighting, chalkboards, and projectors.

TELEVISION:

A black & white set is available in the first floor lounge, and a color set is in the main lounge on the lower level. In addition, both sets are wired to our closed circuit system for special College Center programming.

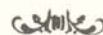
